You are welcome to read and enjoy the September 2013 Newsletter, intended to update you on what Sanyu Babies' Home has been doing over the past three months and the challenges faced in the process. Newspapers have reported many practices that are of great concern to Sanyu Babies' Home, as they threaten the health and integrity of the Orphaned and Vulnerable Children (OVC) throughout the country. The worrisome practices (or crimes) include child sacrifice, theft of babies from hospital, child trafficking for recruitment in slavery, prostitution and for organ transplant. We all need to double our efforts in advocacy for the OVC. We need to develop skills and strengthen regulations for processing foster care and adoption. We need to strengthen and build capacity for social works (identification of surviving family members and relatives of our babies/ children, follow-up and supervising foster and

adoptive families). All these require your support, since it costs a lot of resources (financial, human and educational, transportation, etc.) to do a good job. We are counting on you to continue to pray and advocate for any type of help for Sanyu Babies' Home as you have always done. May God bless you always!

## **Rest in Peace: Silas Wasswa**



We are deeply saddened of the sudden passing of Samuel's twin brother, Silas Wasswa, on 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2013, at the age of 4 months. As some of you may have read in the previous newsletters, baby Silas has had so much to endure within his short life. Together with his twin brother Samuel, Silas arrived at Sanyu on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2013, at the age of 6 days old, weighing only 1.4 kgs. He had just been moved out from the isolation room and started receiving physiotherapy. On 19<sup>th</sup> July 2013, his tiny body developed a fever and cough. He was immediately rushed to Mengo Hospital where he passed away so suddenly on 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2013 due to Severe Bronchopneumonia. Silas left Samuel by himself in the bunk baby bed they used to share. Silas will

always be a precious part of Sanyu family, whilst he is now safe in Jesus' loving arms. Please keep Samuel in your prayers that he will continue to gain weight and be shielded from sickness.

## Physiotherapy department at Sanyu

Due to the increasing needs of physiotherapy for the babies, Sanyu currently hired 2 physiotherapists, Stephen and Juliet, who take turns in coming for 3 hours, every Tuesday and Thursday morning. The physiotherapists are part of the independent Physiotherapy Department at Mengo Hospital called Pancare Services. They take some time during class sessions to give necessary treatments in the physiotherapy room located next to the babies' class. The ones prioritized are children with abnormalities; such as cerebral palsy, autism, delayed milestones, slow learners, and lack of concentration. Some of the children who are currently getting treatments are Hannah, Nicholas, Samuel, Jacinta and Robert. The tools used include: massage lotion/therapy oil, toys, music player, walker, standing frame, etc. Due to the limited therapy & therapists we have within a week, we encourage volunteers to continue to help the children to reach their milestones by, for instance, interacting with the passive babies or helping them to crawl, walk and stand. We also encourage skilled physiotherapists and pediatric doctors to volunteer their services. We are looking forward to having permanent physiotherapy sessions in Sanyu in the long run.

## Disposable diapers donated by the Lucas Legacy

In 2009 I spent my summer volunteering at a baby home in Kampala, Uganda. While there, I fell in love with a baby boy named Lucas. He was sick a lot, and I remember spending my days with him in the hot quarantine room – rocking and singing to him, and praying he would get well.

After I returned home to the states, I did everything I could to keep receiving news and updates about how Lucas was – and I hoped that one day I would be able to return to Africa and adopt him. My dreams were shattered when I learned that, just a few short months after I had come home, Lucas had died from sickle cell anemia.

My heart was broken, and I waited two years before going back to visit Lucas' grave. I stayed for two weeks at Sanyu, here Lucas had spent the last months of his precious life, and I realized something that would change me forever: even though Lucas was gone, there were still so many little ones who needed help, love, and a chance at dignity.

I went home with a new passion, and with the help of close family members, started a non-profit organization called The Lucas Legacy. The mission is simple: we are dedicated to maintaining the dignity of orphaned children by creating partnerships with the homes supporting them. To honor Lucas and his friends at Sanyu, our first project raised funds to provide Sanyu with over 13,000 disposable diapers.

We began spreading the word about what we were doing, and set up an online marketplace where people could buy gifts and unique merchandise. It didn't take long for individuals to start joining our vision, and the funds started coming in.

In June my sister and I had the privilege of going back to Sanyu to be present when the first shipment of almost 5000 Pampers arrived. My heart was so full as I watched the mamas and little ones smiling and thanking us. It seemed like we had done something so small, but the impact of showing love is so incredible, and in the end we were blessed just as much as them.

Sanyu will receive more shipments throughout the year, but the work is never done. Caring for around fifty babies is hard, and I know the love they share with each child changes their young lives. I encourage each of you to think of what you can do for the children of Sanyu, whether it is by making a simple donation, or praying for them daily. ## Raising Funds for the Security Boundary Wall

I went on my first trip to Uganda in August of 2012 and stayed at Sanyu Babies' Home. I really enjoyed getting to know the children and mamas, so when I decided to go back in March of 2013, I stayed at Sanyu to serve again. When I returned from this trip, my husband and I began to talk about how we could help more from home at Sanyu. We emailed Barbara and asked her for any specific things we could begin praying for. One of her responses was that we could pray that Sanyu would receive the needed funds to improve its boundary wall. We quickly realized that God had put us in the right place and the right time to be able to pray for and participate in this fund drive.

Three years ago, our dear friends, John and Emily Wiggins, had organized a large group of Christ followers from our local community to do an "Orphan Walk" to raise money and awareness for orphan care causes. This group was aptly named "Friends of the Orphan Jay County." However, due to a new baby expected this summer, they had to step aside from organizing the event this year, and by April, no one had yet volunteered to do the job. After corresponding with Barbara, it did not take long for us to understand that God wanted to use us and the 2013 Orphan Walk to help secure Sanyu Babies' Home by bringing together our community in worship, prayer, and giving. The Friends of the Orphan set a goal in faith to raise US \$20,000 to help get the boundary wall project underway.

The Orphan Walk was held on June 8<sup>th</sup>, and resulted in many hearts being drawn closer to Him and to the little ones that He loves at Sanyu Babies' Home. One of those hearts was a girl who decided to celebrate her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday by bringing her friends to the walk, and in lieu of giving gifts to her, they gave money to Sanyu! Another of those hearts was an anonymous donor who announced a US \$10,000 matching gift at the walk!

We were excited and humbled afterward to be able to gather up and send all of the proceeds from the Orphan Walk to Sanyu Babies' Home. The Friends of the Orphan Jay County had the privilege of seeing just under US \$20,000 transferred to Sanyu Babies Home!

Our hope is that if the Holy Spirit is nudging you to say "Yes" in partnering with Sanyu Babies' Home to provide a SAFE and LOVING home for His little ones, that you will step up!
