

Immaculate Aleziyo (2 months old) arrived on 2nd October 2014, the mob suspected a certain man to have kidnapped her, confronted him and reported the matter to Old Kampala Police Station.

Isaac Komagum (3 days old) arrived on 10th October 2014. He was a result of incest between father and a 15 year-old daughter. Paternal relatives wanted to kill the 15 year-old mother for what had happened. Action Aid International gave her refugee but could not take care of her son as well.

Jonathan Okello (1 day old) arrived on 21st October 2014, abandoned on 20th October 2014 by his mother Atoy Sharon in Lusaze Rubaga Division around 2:00am.

Kevin Kirabo Muwonge (11 months old) arrived on 22nd October 2014, neglected by his biological mother Zawedde Samalie aged 22years. Kevin was severely malnourished and needed special and immediate medical attention.

Edward Mugabi (13 days old) arrived on 24th October 2014, he was born prematurely on 12th October 2014 in China-Uganda Friendship Hospital Naguru to a 22 year old mother Nassozi Ginah a resident of Bweyogerere, who later abandoned him in the intensive care unit of the hospital.

Favor Nalugga (6 months old) arrived on 30th October 2014, she was abandoned by her father at Old Kampala Police Station with an intention of sabotaging detention of his wife who had been caught drunk and staggering on streets.

Vanice Bridget Kyomuhendo (1 week old) arrived on 31st October 2014, abandoned by a mother known as Kyomuhendo Rehema in the intensive care unit of the maternity ward of China-Uganda Friendship Hospital-Naguru.

Teopista Nabbosa (7 months old) arrived on 31st October 2014, abandoned by her father in Mwana Mugimu Nutrition Unit Mulago Hospital on 10th August 2014 just 10 days after admission.

Patience Kwikiriza Asimwe (20 days) arrived on 3rd November 2014, born to a 15 year old mother who was chased from her home, did not know where the child's paternal side lived at the moment and didn't have the means to look after her daughter.







CALLED BACK HOME

Kevin- On October 22, an 11 month-old baby was brought to Sanyu Babies' Home. Kevin was severely malnourished, needing immediate medical attention. The nurses provided around the clock care for this little boy who had suffered so much neglect in his very short life. Kevin even forgot how to cry normally since his cries had never been answered. When he arrived at the babies' home, the first thing you noticed was his large eyes staring up at you, almost questioningly, to see if you would be the one to help him. Kevin was admitted to Mengo Hospital to try to get him stabilized – dedicated mama Irene and Teacher Jacquie spent their days and nights at his bedside trying to encourage him to eat. He then returned to the babies' home where all the staff and volunteers rallied around him, loving and feeding him. His condition took a downward turn, so it was decided to take him to Mulago Hospital to the nutritional ward. Mama Irene was again by his bedside day and night. Despite the best efforts of our dedicated nurses, Juliet and Sylvia and the staff, Kevin passed away at the hospital on 16th November, 2014. It was with great sadness that we said goodbye to Kevin but God had called him home. We know Kevin is now peacefully in God's hands and is suffering no more.



Bridget- On 31st October 2014, Bridget was welcomed into the Sanyu family only weighing 1.2kgs at 7 days old. Immediately following her arrival, the loving nurses of Sanyu quickly assessed her health and medical needs. It was made clear that Bridget needed to be taken to Mengo Hospital for further care. The mamas stayed by her side for the next

MEET OUR NURSES!

There are two people at the babies' home that work tirelessly to ensure that our babies are healthy and strong. Nurse Juliet and Nurse Sylvia are dedicated nurses who are experts about babies and their needs. They work with some very medically fragile babies and bring them back from near death, to healthy, thriving little babies. Some babies even arrive from the hospitals, thin and not well. Our nurses soon have the babies feeding well and gaining weight. Not only do they medically care for the children, but they are also the ones who ensure the children are washing their hands before they eat and overseeing what they eat to make sure they are eating enough and developing properly. Baby Edward who arrived last month, weighing 1.5kg is now 3kg and feeding well. Baby Teopista, arriving from a hospital very thin and weak now eats very well and is gaining weight.
