



VOLUNTEER REPORT – Alison Myers



It's July 15th 2014 and I'm sitting at the airport, headed home after spending a week with a special friend I met while staying at Sanyu this past January. As I sit here, I'm catching myself reflecting, yet again, on my short time at Sanyu and the everlasting impression it left on my heart. The children and the new relationships I made were more than I ever could have imagined. Those three weeks were by far the best experience of my life. Each day was challenging yet rewarding, and heartbreak yet so full of joy. I arrived very guarded but nothing could prepare me for the way these children would grip my heart and change my world.

My time at Sanyu gave me a new appreciation for things I didn't even realize I take for granted. I probably hung more laundry in 3 weeks than I've dried in my dryer in the past 3 years. I sorted LOTS of beans by hand. I brushed my teeth with bottled water. People living in villages often walk ½ mile to get water, unclean water. Sanyu typically houses about 50 children, ages 1 day to 4 years. Try to imagine meal time, potty time, bath time, anytime really. 50 kids under 4 are A LOT of kids and a LOT of noise. And there is no break at the end of the day- it's round the clock care for these children. The mama's cook over an open coal fire in a small closed up room- FOR 50+ kids, 3 meals a day, 7 days a week. I now have a much deeper love for my stove, and my microwave, and my kitchen sink that has both hot and cold water, and all the little utensils that fill my cabinet drawer making it hard to open. Despite not having many of the modern day luxuries that most have probably never considered living without, the home runs smoothly and the children are filled with smiles and laughter that is contagious.

At the end of my first day I came to the conclusion that I didn't have a clue about hard work. The mama's are some of the hardest working women I've ever met. Not only is their day filled with physical challenges, but I was mentally exhausted when I went back to my room. I think I slept for 3 days when I got back home to the states.

If you're looking for a way to give back, a humanitarian project, or a place to serve with your middle or high school children, I couldn't suggest a better place than Sanyu. The mama's and other staff were welcoming and friendly, I felt very safe, Joel's cooking was AMAZING, and I thoroughly enjoyed my time!! I can guarantee that your life will be impacted.

Sanyu friends, you will forever hold a special place in my heart. Thank you a million times over for your kind hearts and your love for the children. Since it's now my plan to visit annually, I'll see you very soon!

Meet one of our Teachers – Jacquelyn Nassali

Jacquie has been a teacher at Sanyu Babies' Home for the last five years. She grew up in Nansana with her mother and father and her three siblings – one sister and two brothers. Jacquie is married with three children, two 4yr. olds and one 7yr. old. Before becoming a teacher, she was considering becoming a police officer. What changed her mind? She decided that the dangers of riots and tear gas were too great, so decided to become a teacher instead. She obtained her Early Childhood Development certificate and began to look for a job where she could work with young children. She knew that she needed a job that didn't require her to sit all day as she prefers to be active and to keep busy. At Sanyu she finds there is plenty of action all day and never a moment that is not busy!




Jacquie loves to greet visitors with her big smile and a loud 'Hello! How are you?' She welcomes volunteers to come to Sanyus and help with the babies. She gives many hours each week teaching the children and volunteers are always appreciated to help in the classrooms.

Jacquie's wish list for the children is to have an improved security wall, financial help for the ongoing medical bills as some of the babies arrive very sick, a better and safer playground and a large paddling pool for all the children to enjoy, rather than individual baby baths.

Update: Baby Hope

Since our last newsletter, Hope has had a series of health setbacks, but she keeps on fighting and we are praying for our Lord to continue watching over her. You may remember Hope arrived at Sanyu weighing 1.6kg. It was discovered that she had an umbilical hernia that required immediate surgery. Usually the doctor would have liked to wait until she was a bit older; however, it was not possible to postpone the surgery any longer. She successfully recovered from this surgery, but then contracted pneumonia and had to be hospitalized again. She has since returned to Sanyu and hopefully her hospital visits are over for a while. The mama's are working hard to help this little

one become stronger and begin to gain some weight. Our prayers are with baby Hope on her road to recovery. These situations are why we so appreciate those who are able to make monetary donations so that we can ensure that these vulnerable babies receive the medical treatment they so urgently need.

Meet one of our Mama's – Mama Rosira

It's not hard to find Mama Rosira – just look for the mama who has a bright smile and a different hat on each day! She is the one busily engaged in completing her daily tasks, but always has the time to stop by a baby's crib to give them a little hug, a tickle or simply chat with them. Mama Rosira can never pass by a child that is crying or sad. She will pick that baby up and keep on working with him at her side.

Mama Rosira has worked at Sanyu for four years. She is a single mother, raising three children: 2 boys and 1 girl aged 15yrs., 14yrs., and 10yrs. old. Her day begins at 6:30am when she gets ready for work and then begins her walk to Sanyu so she can start her shift by 7:30am. She works 12-hour days; 3 days, 3 nights and then 3 days off. On her days off she often spends her days cleaning her house!



She is very grateful for the experience she has gained in caring for the babies at Sanyu. When she started working at Sanyu she had experience from raising her own children; however, now her experience is extensive, as she understands different characters of children, can identify certain childhood diseases and is familiar with working with children with special needs.

Her dream for the children of Uganda is that parents would care more for their children. She has a great love for children and you can see that in the tenderness that she shows toward each child. She would love to see Sanyu grow so they can help more babies and for those children that are reaching the age of having to leave Sanyu, that they can expand to continue to care for them as they get older, so that the orphans continue to feel safe and secure. The hardest part of working at Sanyu is having to say goodbye to those children that she has grown so close to. Tears fill her eyes when she thinks of those children that she has recently seen leave. While she is happy that they are joining a family, she also finds it very difficult not knowing how things turn out for them. Her pray is that they will be loved as much as she has loved them.

It's because of people like Mama Rosira that Sanyu is able to be a sanctuary for many traumatized babies. Over the years, her loving arms have soothed many babies, wiped many tears and celebrated many victories in the lives of our babies. Thank you Mama Rosira for your dedicated service and for caring for those little ones who had no one else to.

Volunteer Opportunities at Sanyu Babies' Home


