LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN



On behalf of the Board of Governors and staff of Sanyu Babies' Home (SBH) I greet all our readers in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We very sincerely thank all people of good will that have supported SBH in the first quarter of 2017. SBH has now seriously embarking on **preliminary work for development**. The programme is three-pronged, involving: first, the construction of a boundary wall (in addition to doing extensive renovation work on existing buildings); then, build a commercial property on the existing SBH site at Mengo (three kilometers from Kampala City center); to give the Home a more sure buffer permanent income source, to improve the Home funding (income); and, lastly, gradually, to pursue development of a new SBH village on our expansion site of a five (5) acre piece of land at Buloba (some 15 kilometers from Kampala). Over the years, this development work will be undertaken in phases. Part of the current first phase has been extensive renovation of existing buildings in the Home (completed). The other work in the phase which has been embarked on is the boundary wall. The second phase is the commercial building at Mengo (plans are advanced in preparing working drawings and seeking their approval from Development Control Authorities). The third phase would be for Buloba (this is a very big project). Because of different

sizes of these projects, these works will be divided into sub-phases. Greater details of these projects will be communicated from time to time.

SBH will embark on new strategies of raising development funds. We shall need a great deal of support. In the meantime, kindly pray for us.

He was abandoned by an unknown person at Rubaga Miracle Centre Cathedral and rescued by Rosemary Kyampiire who reported the case to Lakeside Police Post forwarded to Old Kampala Police Station from where the child was referred to Sanyu Babies' Home.

Cyrus Byakatonda (7 months) arrived on 31st Mar 2017. He was rescued from a mentally ill mother at Synagogue Church of all nations by the Wandegaya Police Station.

Prayers needed for Patricia



On 21st February, 2017, Baby Patricia was brought to Sanyu Babies' Home. At 6 days old, she only weighed 1.5 Kgs. Patricia was very sick needing immediate medical attention. The nurses provided around the clock care for this little girl. After a few days, Patricia was admitted at Mengo Hospital to try to get her stabilized- dedicated maama Maria spent her days and nights at her bedside trying to encourage her to eat. After 3 weeks, Patricia was returned home. Unfortunately, her condition worsened and she was rushed to Mulago Hospital for further management. She is currently in so much pain battling with complications from Pediatric HIV/Aids and severe diarrhea. Please keep Patricia in your prayers for God's healing hand to touch her.

Interview with Sanyu Staff and Volunteers

Sanyu Babies' Home is blessed to have a wide range of paid and voluntary staff. Here's a snapshot of a few dedicated helpers at Sanyu:

Allen, teacher



How long have you worked as a teacher at Sanyu?

This is my 6th year as a teacher here.

How old are the children in your care?

They are between 6 months old to two years; I usually teach the middle class.

What is the typical day with the children like?

There are many different activities; it all depends on the weather. We have a timetable but it is flexible. We teach the children how to interact, teach them different habits that will help them, like being kind to each other, sharing, how to play with the toys, concentration, etc. We even allow them to swim sometimes!

Do you have a good piece of advice for teaching children so young?

Be firm and stick to one instruction at a time!

What is your favourite activity to do with the children?

I like doing work at their tables with them, like finger painting. I also love singing and teaching them songs.

I've been volunteering for 2 weeks so far, I've been coming every day.

What is your favourite task to complete with the children?

I love bathing them and feeding them, especially the little babies.

If you could do anything for these children what would it be?

I would like to take the older children out to a school where they can learn. I would also love to take the children outside of Sanyu to see other things in Kampala.

Why do you volunteer at Sanyu?

I love the babies. They make you forget your worries, even when you have a lot on your mind. They bring out the best in you and if one day you want to be a good mother, you can be a good mother to these children first.

Visiting the Baby Class- Lubna Rahman



I spent some time in the pre-school class today to see what goes on for those children who can sit up independently. As a primary school teacher from the UK, I was intrigued what the children did in this 'class time'.

As I entered, there were volunteers with the teacher, playing with the children with toys. Children become very excited when they spot an adult who will be happy to show them affection and attention. Playing with Elijah, who is teething, he is beginning to understand how the abacus toy can be pushed from one side to the other, but primarily he wants to bite things, including me!

Listening to songs is a big part of baby class. Thanks to an old song DVD and an enthusiastic teacher, the children sat mesmerized by the nursery rhymes and songs. I think it was important for me and the others, to make this time spent a productive one,

showing the children how to clap rhythms and react to the music in some way and use the toys to explore their understanding of how things work and interact with them positively.



General chores such as nappy changing and feeding must be taken care of in the course of the morning and naps for exhausted little ones.

The children have so much potential and are so happy to meet adults who will spend time with them and interact with them, I'm hoping a productive use of play will eventually lead to happy, engaged learners of the future.

Hi I am Lyn I am a 63 year old single lady who came here to Sanyu Babies' Home to volunteer for three months to fulfil a life time dream. I arrived in the beginning of January and I return home on the 3rd of April.

I have truly enjoyed my time here, staying in the guest house which is onsite with 24hr security and with Joel who is the guest house manager. He has taken very good care of me, keeping everything clean and tidy, cooking the evening meals, and washing the sheets and towels as requested. The beds and rooms are comfortable, and there is hot water for showers (a lot of places in Uganda have only cold water which is a bit shocking if you are not used to it).

Spending time with the babies has just been wonderful, each one has their own personality, and I found that I was drawn to quite a number of them, but they all touch your heart. The time spent with the babies can be tiring but you can set your own pace to suit your individual energy levels. There are many other areas where you can lend a hand, such as the laundry (which is never ending), helping out with the washing of the babies' bottles, and sorting clothes into different categories for the different age groups.

The midwives and the Mamas are lovely and welcoming although language barriers can be hard at times. Generally, everyone is very friendly and appreciative of the help that volunteers give.

All in all I have loved it here and will be very sad to leave.
