In the past three months, we have had 11 children arriving into the Sanyu Family and a massive 19 children left through reunification with family, fostering or adoption! 1 child was transferred to another institution. We thank God for providing these children with happy forever families.

Robinah Nalubega (2 years) arrived on 12th January 2014, was abandoned out of confusion by a cyclist who had been paid by an unknown woman to ride her to a certain home, which home refused to accept her.

Charles Katende (3 weeks) arrived on 14th January 2014, was abandoned in a trench by his biological mother who is mentally ill.

Simon Nsubuga (3 years) arrived on 24th January 2014, was a victim of child trafficking in Yesu Amala zone, Nansana.

Dalton Mukiibi (5 months) arrived on 24th January 2014, was a victim of child trafficking in Nansana by people who tactfully took him from his parents claiming they would take care of him

Eclas Isabirye (3 years) arrived on 10th March 2014, he was a victim of physical torture by his step mother who together with his biological father later on abandoned him at Nankulabye.

Abigail Celine Furaha (1.5 years) arrived on 21st March 2014, she was abandoned by her biological mother in Kisenyi, Kiganda zone- Kampala District.

Welcome to our Babies Class!!



The babies' class is for babies between the ages of 6 months and approx. 1.5 years of age or whenever they are confident walkers. As you can imagine, it is a very busy place caring for the needs and development of 16 little ones. The babies attend this class Monday – Friday mornings. After their morning baths and feeding, they are taken to the classroom where they are surrounded by toys, music and loving teachers. Each day consists of interacting with the babies, changing diapers, bottle feedings, singing, clapping, cuddles and the teachers celebrate the growth and achievements of the babies.

Teacher Maureen Nakayi has been working in the babies' class since 2010. Maureen's dad died when she was 9 yrs. old and her mom died when she was 14yrs. old. Since she was young, she has always enjoyed being around children. That is why she decided to continue her studies in nursery teaching where she received her certificate in 2010. She lives with her grandmother, her 12yr. old son and her brother. She is a single mom working hard to support her son who is in Primary 6. Maureen enjoys interacting with the babies and is happy to see some of the sick and weak babies get well and start smiling again.

Teacher Allen Luyiga has also been at Sanyu Babies' Home since 2010. She grew up in a family where there were many children. She feels it was God's plan for her to work with babies as she believes all children are her brothers and sisters. She completed her Early Childhood Development diploma through the YMCA. She applied at Sanyu's and has been working there since. She leaves home around 6 – 6:30am and arrives at Sanyu's at 7:30am. Allen enjoys singing and dancing with the babies and seeing the babies clap their hands to the music. There is one baby girl, Miriam that Allen feels especially close to. She remembers when Miriam first arrived. Miriam wouldn't allow anyone to touch her except a few people. When she first came

VOLUNTEER REPORT – Emma Holmes



My name is Emma and I am from Victoria, BC, Canada. I am seventeen years old and recently moved to Uganda with my family. At first I struggled with the new culture of Uganda and often found myself very homesick. As the New Year approached I reflected on why I had first been excited to come to Uganda and that was for the opportunities I would have to work with young children. I did some research and found out we were a short drive from the Sanyu Babies' Home and soon I, along with my mom and sister were being given a tour of the home!

I have been volunteering here for about two months now and love it! One little girl has left a lasting impression on me and despite the advice to not grow attached to the children she has a special place in my heart. The first time I saw Robinah she was new to the Babies' Home. She wouldn't smile and sat lifeless by herself. She obviously was not a healthy toddler when she first arrived and I remember writing in my journal *"She is such a beautiful child of God and it scares me to see how fragile her little life is"* Thanks to the love and care of the babies home I have watched Robinah blossom into a healthy little girl! Here is an excerpt from my blog where I talked a little about her *"you will catch her beautiful eyes looking up at you when you're not looking at her and the second you look in her eyes she looks away. You can tell she is recovering from trauma and looks in constant pain. I cannot imagine the type of situation she was in before she was brought to the safety and comfort of the babies' home. Last week as I sat in the babies classroom I watched as a little boy crawled over to her and they started playing together...slowly a smile stretched across her mouth and her beautiful face lit up for the first time since arriving at the babies home! Today as I played with her she laughed, clapped her hands, attempted to crawl around the room, started speaking sounds, hugged me and even gave me a high five ALL with a smile on her face! It was a miracle! Watching her grow from a traumatized, aching, crying, sad little girl to the bubbly cutie*
